

Our Dance Company

InsideOutside Dance is a NDIS registered dance school based in Brisbane for people of all ages with different abilities owned by International Model Madeline Stuart. It is run by Rosanne Stuart, who has a strong business and community connections locally, nationally and internationally.

We work with young people with a disability, providing them with opportunities to learn a variety of dance styles and engage in performances and workshops in a nurturing safe environment. We launched in February 2016 and now have over 100 students at eleven venues across Brisbane. Our classes are low cost, high energy and great fun. As well as keeping fit, our students are also learning skills for life including:

- Confidence
- Socialisation
- Communication
- Teamwork
- Leadership
- Self-awareness

Over the past 2 years we have secured performance opportunities at The Special Olympics dinner dance, The All Ability Balls in Hervey Bay and Bundaberg and Access Arts end of year event and the Royal Ballet. We were also finalists in the 2016 Longman Awards for Business Achievement. Our Owner/Ambassador Madeline Stuart is a great inspiration to our students. We aim:

- To provide educational and dance performance opportunities for young People with a disability.
- To create a dynamic, flowing and exciting working environment for our performers, teachers and students through using global best practice to provide the ultimate dance experience.
- To work with our communities to engage them in positive, inclusive activities that bring all walks of the community together for a common goal to enjoy dance.

OUR DANCE TEACHERS

Sheru Bharadwaja

Sheru was born in Berlin, Germany, and moved to Australia in 1983. He grew up living an active lifestyle filled with sports and music, before finding his real passion in life – dance, in 2005. He has trained under some of the world's best including Electric Boogaloo legends Mr Wiggles, Suga Pop and Poppin' Pete.

In 2012 Sheru was chosen to star in Southern Comfort's TV ad where he plays 'Mr Pop'. In the same year, Sheru and his crew Swagamama were contestants on channel 10's TV show Everybody Dance Now. In 2013, Swagamama reached the grand finals of Australia's Got Talent, making Sheru a two-time Australia's Got Talent grand finalist.

Recently, Sheru has been focusing more on corporate dance work with Swagamama. Since its inception in 2012, Swagamama has grown to a line-up of 15 dancers, and is one of Australia's most successful street dance based acts. He also regularly judges national and international level events such as Hip Hop Internationals and World Supremacy Battlegrounds.





Sheree Fitzgerald

Sheree Fitzgerald is a performer, choreographer and teacher of many styles of dance and the performing arts. As a performer she has worked in Children's Entertainment with The Entertainment Store, and has also been a part of contemporary company performances with both the Dark Horse Theatre (2016) and Outcast Performing Arts (2014). More recently, however, she has become a part of Candy Shop Show Australia as a Cabaret performer. With Candy Shop, Sheree performs as a singer, dancer and actor as part of their original cabaret shows; The Jazz Age Dance Cabaret, Sugar Sugar! And Up, Up & Away! As well as singing and dancing with the company, in corporate gigs around Brisbane. Having studied at Village on Broadway in Sydney, Sheree holds a Cert IV in Dance Performance. She also trained from the age of seven at Sharon Alback's Dance Centre in many styles including Jazz, Tap, Ballet, Hip Hop and Contemporary.

Sheree was given the opportunity to be an assistant teacher from the age of 14 at Alback's, and greatly values the experience and the knowledge that she gained in her time there. However it wasn't until Sheree took on her own project, choreographing for Clairvoux Mickillop College's production of "The Addams Family Musical", that she really found her love for teaching and choreography. Pursuing that love has found her teaching school workshops, facilitating Kindergarten dance programs, and as Dance Coordinator at Red Music Centre, teaching Jazz, Ballet, Hip Hop and Musical Theatre. Sheree is keen to continue expanding her teaching experience and is very excited to work with Inside Outside this year!

Nadia Milford

Nadia is a dance artist inspired by a vision to create a more compassionate world. As a performer, choreographer and teacher she engages people in experiences that encourage awareness and empowerment. Since graduating with distinction from a Bachelor of Fine Arts, Dance Performance, at Queensland University of Technology Nadia has worked with key leaders within the arts industry on professional projects and created various independent works. She previously performed for Expressions Dance Company in 2013 and 2014 as well as choreographed for Blue Roo Theatre Company in collaboration with the Queensland Opera. She created her first independent work in 2015, for Fresh Blood Festival, which was performed again in 2High Festival 2016. Nadia has since choreographed works and performed for multiple Brisbane arts festivals (DIY, Nexus, Festival of Australian Student Theatre, CreateX, IndepenDANCE, The Gallery of Modern Art's 10th Anniversary and Angry Mime), as well as the Beijing Dance Festival in China. An active member of the arts community, Nadia also performed as a part of Supercell's Index program in February 2017 and performed this work at the Empire theatre again in December 2017.

Last year Nadia was awarded Arts Queensland's Individuals Fund for a professional development project spanning nine European countries including master classes, workshops and festivals. During this time Nadia also performed in Surge Collective's work 'Enough' in Belcampo Cafe Amsterdam and '@_WHY' at Supercell Dance Festival in 2018. In conjunction with her performance commitments Nadia holds regular contemporary workshops in regional areas and teaches in Brisbane. Nadia has been on the Phluxus2 Dance Collective team since 2016.



Kate Woods

Kate competed competitively in Women's Artistic Gymnastics (WAG) growing up, and began coaching WAG in grade 6. She retired as a level 6 gymnast, however began coaching at local studios and here she learned to use her gymnastics skills in a dance context. It was also at this time that she began, and subsequently fell in love, with dance. Kate studied at The University of Queensland, completing her undergraduate Bachelor with an Extended Major in Psychology and Minor in Criminology. While studying at university, Kate never lost her passion for dance and began learning from renowned performers with a focus on ballet and contemporary. After graduating from university, Kate decided to pursue dancing and completed a versatile dance course the next year. During the past 9 years, she continued to coach acrobatics at studios and after 13 years of teaching, she still loves being able to help others gain new skills and fall in love with acrobatics as she has. Kate continues to train across a wide range of styles and remains passionate about dancing.
